Pastor's Message - Lilly Renewal Grant for 2025

I (Pastor Michelle) am due for a sabbatical at six years of service to St. Paul United Church of Christ. In conversation with my pastoral relations team and the church council, I am proposing taking 3 1/2 months in the summer of 2025— as July 2, 2025 will be 7 years after I started at St. Paul UCC. Part of this was deciding to submit an application to the Lilly Foundation for a competitive renewal grant. The grant would include funds for the pastor's trip and some moneys for church renewal activities during this time. This is a proposal based on receiving the moneys, and a restructured agenda would be presented if the funds would not be received by the foundation. We want to keep you up-to-date on the status of the grant as we will find out more in the late summer.

The Lilly Foundation Grant asks what activities will make "the pastor's heart sing."

The process of creation is part of our work with God to build God's Realm in this world. When we came together nearly six years ago, we both brought our creative roots with us - for St. Paul UCC, it was through the music ministry. For me, the arts continue to refill my soul. One of my self-care activities is working on my art. To me, I connect with God when I'm creating a picture on a piece of wood, painting a picture, or even writing prayers, liturgy, and poetry.

If I could name this sabbatical, I would name this "Creative Roots." Taking a sabbatical with the activities planned will be a way for me to refill my spiritual bag of creative tools. It will give me new ideas for sermon illustrations and innovative ways I can weave the elements of a worship service together. Being able to stir the bowl of creation in my life allows my heart to sing and spirit to soar.

I continue to seek ways to incorporate more creative programs into the life of the church, into my ministry, and into my life. I feel that God has called me to use my first degree - as an English major with a writing concentration - for the healing and joy of God's realm. I believe that dedicated time to create and be inspired by new scenes will be a catalyst to design more innovative ways of ministry. Even now, sitting in cafes writing, in a park drawing, or connecting with people through community events nourishes my soul. Like most pastors, I do not have much dedicated time to create as it takes much intentionality to carve time for art and writing. Freeing myself from the everyday tasks and taking dedicated time for those activities - whether in North America or Western Europe- will help me see creation from a new angle.

Additionally I marvel at the historical connection that St. Paul members have with their German ancestry. As this has warmed my heart in the years I've been with the church, it has reminded me that I, too, must spend time connecting with my ancestral roots.

Just as I await a time of creation, St. Paul UCC is also ready. They have been pondering ways that can invite more art, music, and writing into our building. St. Paul is a congregation extremely connected to its history and invested in discovering God's call for the church's tomorrow. A church that asks itself, "How can we connect our spirit of creation with our historical roots?" takes the various beautiful threads of the past 185 years and begins to knit something new for the future.

This season of renewal for both the church and me is one where we can recall our stories and our gifts. Our souls have opportunities to find joy and rest in this time of sabbath.

Congregation's views as to the benefit of the program:

In Leviticus 25, the Israelites are advised to take a break every 7 years. And so it is with Pastor Michelle. She is on call 24/7, and a break from her job will invigorate her physical body and her mind and will help her to reconnect to God as her spirit rests, also. We expect our pastor to come back refreshed and revived with new energy for her job, and we believe she will have new ideas to inspire the activities of our congregation. She can use her experiences, her exposure to other cultures, and her family connections to enhance her sermons, develop new activities centered around her experiences, and strengthen her own personal relationship to God, all of which will help us in her role as our leader. This rest will prepare her to continue her ministry at St. Paul's without fear of burnout.

Pastor's Message - Lilly Renewal Grant for 2025

Congregation's plan during the sabbatical:

Prior to the beginning of the sabbatical, we will invite our conference minister to our service on May 11. We will have a litany of blessing for both the congregation and the pastor. Following worship, we will have a lunch and social time to bless one another before Pastor Michelle departs. St. Paul has a 30+ year tradition of fine arts series. To recognize her leave-taking, sabbatical return, and congregational renewal, we will create a series of fine arts concerts that celebrates the theme and focus of Creative Roots. Considered will be: Masterpiece works by classical composers to be presented by local musicians with appropriate artwork backgrounds; a concert presented by the Music Departments of Belleville High Schools; a handbell concert; and a concert by The United States Air Force Band of Mid-America. We are planning a guided tour of The St. Louis Art Museum to study works of German and French artists. We will offer a variety of creative arts classes (ex: woodburning, ceramics, flower arranging, and painting) taught by our members and local artists, utilizing the artistic gifts of the congregation. We will invite members to share their artistic gifts on Sundays during worship. Presentations might include liturgical dance, musical performance, voice, dramatic arts, and poetry readings as well as an art gallery in our Welcome Center displaying members' own creations.

After the sabbatical, we will have a "welcome home" reception with cake and punch and joint sessions to reflect together on our renewal activities.





Please mail your information by March 15th.


The flowers will include Lilies, Daffodils, Hyacinth & Tulips. You may take a flower home on Easter.


