

The Search Team comprised of Donna Nettleton, Chairperson; Al Scharf, Dana Rosenzweig, Roger Henke, Terry Kalinowski, Susan Relfe, Tina Lake-Hopper, Donna Davis and the late Jim Means, brought their recommendation to the Church Council on March 15th. Their recommendation passed unanimously.

This past Sunday, the Search Team's recommendation was announced at the 9am Traditional and 11am Celebration Services.
