## Everything is Faith Formation

I took a class on Christian Education during my second year of seminary. I learned many important lessons during my time in the class (and will share more as time goes on). But the greatest piece of wisdom I learned was this: everything is faith formation.

Much of the time, we believe our learning comes from studying books or even listening to sermons. However, each and everything we do around us impacts the way we look at who God is, what does it mean to be church, who is Jesus the Christ, etc. For instance, if we have few images of Jesus as a Middle Eastern man, what does that say about our theology of Jesus? If we only use “Father God” in the way we speak to God, how are we limiting the way we communicate about our Eternal God? What does it mean for our message of hospitality if areas of the building cannot be accessed by people with disabilities?

Once you go to seminary, this type of theological reflection happens constantly as you go about your day. In the United Church of Christ, a clergy person is considered pastor *AND* teacher. *While teaching doesn't always happen in classrooms, we as educators ensure that our messages consistently follow the love of God and the dignity that Jesus the Christ shared with his followers. We know that each sign, each classroom and - YES - even each bathroom reflects how we communicate our faith. Everything - from the size of toilet stalls to the posters on our walls are part of how we communicate faith formation.*

So as we enter the month of July, I ask you all to take a look around? How does everything from the sanctuary to our activity center to the wall hangings and more represent our number one value: **WE BELIEVE ALL PEOPLE MATTER TO GOD and are welcome here.**

In what ways do we consistently communicate this message? How can we communicate this better through our programs, building, worship, and pastoral care? How can we ensure all people know that they make a difference to God? If you have ideas on how we can communicate this value, please let us know!

July 2 will be my first anniversary with the church. This first year has been a blessing to me. I look forward to our next year together!
