Judge (Ret). Annette A. Eckert, of Belleville, Illinois, was appointed an Associate Judge in the 20th Judicial Circuit 1991. In 2002, she became the first female elected Circuit Judge in the 20th Judicial Circuit, where she presided in the Felony Division. In 2015, Judge (Ret.) Eckert and the Juvenile Justice Council of St. Clair County developed the St. Clair County Teen Court, a restorative justice conferencing and peer jury diversion court for first time nonviolent offenders. She has served as the volunteer St. Clair County Teen Court Director for the last five years, during which time the court has graduated 204 teens and had a recidivism rate of 8.3%.

I believe that we are moving Onwards and Upwards in our programs and activities here at St. Paul UCC!

While Covid still presents many challenges in this greater community, we continue to find ways to regather safely as well as expand our opportunities to get together, to minister to our congregants, and to care for our community, even with a few mitigations in place.

Many of our congregants have enjoyed gathering at the Culinaire's monthly breakfast and during coffee hour on the other Sundays of each month. Our quilters, centering prayer group, women's guild, and Fireside have found opportunities to gather in recent weeks.

Also embracing this Onwards and Upwards mindset is our Visioning Team. As of my time writing this article, we have met once and are planning a meeting for the very end of August as we work to create a plan for this process.

Our Christian Education Team has been working to scheduling faith formation experiences for our younger congregants. On the second and fourth Sundays of each month, we are holding Sunday School for our elementary school-aged youth, and we are planning on holding a gathering for our middle and senior high youth once per month.

We have collected over \$40,000 (which includes \$15,000 matching gift from an anonymous donor) for the "How Sweet the Sound" offering which helps to fund the Capital Technology Improvement Project.

Mother's Day Out has begun their 2021-22 school year! With the leadership of Sue Hoffmann, our excellent teachers have planned some wonderful things for this school year, and we thank St. Paul congregants who are volunteering to help the program this year.

Things may not look 100% the same as before Covid, but, without a doubt, we continue to be the Church- passionate about loving our neighbor and sharing God's light just as it has always been.

The Neighbors in Need offering supports the UCC's ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund a wide array of local and national justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. Through ucc.org/justice, our national Justice and Witness Ministries office offers resources, news updates, and action alerts on a broad spectrum of justice issues. Working with members of the UCC Justice and Peace Action Network (a network of thousands of UCC justice and peace advocates), Justice and Witness continues its strong policy advocacy work on issues such as the federal budget, voting rights, immigration, health care, hate crimes, civil liberties, and environmental justice. Neighbors in Need also supports our American Indian neighbors in the UCC. One-third of the offering supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Historically, forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin, and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S.
