Pastor's Message New Life All Around Us

I grew up on the west side of Belleville, and I've see so many changes since heading to college in 1991 and returning to the area in 2018. As I drive on West Main Street, I notice the empty lot where Fischer's once sat, and I recall all of the memories held in the building, from my eighth grade graduation party to my 20th high school reunion. As I continue to drive, I point out the location of Cedarleaf Photography, and I recalled the afternoon that I got my senior portraits taken. And as I drive, I see the location where Tribout's once was, and I recall going there with my parents who would occasionally buy me a little trinket from the store.

I'm sure for many of you who have lived around here since childhood, you've seen many buildings torn down and others built. And with these torn down buildings, we all wonder what will take its place. It makes our hearts sad to grieve some of the changes—especially with places like Fischer's no longer part of our community.

What new life will appear in the spots where our memories were once held? And even if nothing is built on the spot, we know that exciting changes are still happening in other old locations around town, and exciting memories will transpire in these new locales.

Holy Week and Easter reminds us that sometimes we have to go through the Good Fridays of our lives—the torn down buildings, the medical tests and surgeries, the grief, and some changes. I don't believe it's God's plan to endure these difficult events. Such happenings occur because of our human and earthly frailty. But God often brings about something beautiful from the changes, wreckage, the illness, and the ashes. It's the springtime after the harsh winter—the warmer breezes and the budding trees.

Changes happen everywhere—even in our church. This time of visioning will help shine a light on the gifts in our congregation, even if this points to changes: breaking down or restructuring programs to build something new that will flourish like the springtime flowers. I'm excited to have our visioning facilitator Dr. Lisa Withrow speaking at our April 10 worship service and meeting with our visioning teams while she is in town.

While you may be reading this in the depths of Lent or the heart of Holy Week, I pray that God blesses us with Easter moments and continuous resurrection, whether it's in our town, in our homes, in our health, and in our congregation.

Building Faith, Building Capacity, Building For The Next 60 Years Oct. 2021-Dec. 2022

DuBois Center will turn 60 in 2022, marking the year we took ownership of the land. While the first 60 years have been great, she needs some maintenance and expansion to get her ready for the next 60.

PASTORAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE

A Pastoral Relations Committee was formed in the fall of 2021. This is a standing committee in the congregation, with the purpose of supporting a healthy relationship between the pastor and congregants in order to enhance the effectiveness of the church's ministry. The committee serves in two primary ways

- 1. as an advisory group to the pastor: sharing ideas, dreams, expectations, and concerns of the congregation with the pastor;
- 2. as a support group for the pastor's leadership: interpreting roles, functions, boundaries, opportunities, and needs of the pastor to the congregation.

The goal of a Pastoral Relations Committee is to promote faithful, shared ministry between the pastor and the congregation.

The committee works in a context of confidentiality, support, care, and honesty with the pastor, while promoting healthy communication as a whole. A Pastoral Relations Committee is an appropriate and confidential place for the pastor to test possible goals for the congregation's life, to receive support for their professional development, to reflect on their overall well-being in ministry, to listen to feedback and strategize potential responses. This committee also provides a means for the congregation to express its care for the pastor by advocating for appropriate compensation and encouraging times for relaxation, exercise, vacation, spiritual development, and personal relationships outside of the congregation. A Pastoral Relations Committee is not an appropriate place to circumvent church processes of decision-making, for committee members to relay anonymous complaints, for individual members to lobby for or enact their own ambitions for church life, or to empanel an adversarial group opposed to the pastor's leadership. Any concerns should first be addressed to the pastor for resolution before presenting them to the members of the committee. With these guidelines in mind, the members of this committee are Ruth Bush, Terry Kalinowski, Mimi LLamas, Donna Nettleton and Dana Rosenzweig.




