The Sabbatical Leave of Rev. Michelle Torigian May 20 through August 26, 2025

What will be Pastor Michelle's interaction with the congregation during her sabbatical?

She will not be taking calls or responding to texts or email messages from May 20 through August 26, 2025 nor will she lead any worship services, funerals, weddings, or baptisms. Of course, you may see Pastor Michelle around town at times. She will not be discussing any church business but will be glad to see you and say *Hello* if you happen to see one another!

Why is Pastor Michelle taking a sabbatical?

Pastors who take sabbatical leave often come back refreshed and having their creative energy renewed. Often clergy who take sabbaticals will have longer pastorates than clergy who do not take them.

Conference guidelines recommend sabbaticals for clergy after five years separate from any vacation, medical/sick, and continuing education time. In Pastor Michelle's contract, it was noted that she could take three months sabbatical after six years. On July 2, she will celebrate her seventh anniversary.

Who will fund the sabbatical?

While Pastor Michelle will still receive her salary and benefits, she and her family will be funding her plans. She will be using her continuing education funds towards this as well.

What are Pastor Michelle's plans during the sabbatical?

May 20 will be her first full day of sabbatical. Preparation will occur between May 20 and May 30 for a trip to Europe.

Pastor Michelle will be heading to London on May 30 with her mom Laureen. They will spend a week in London and then a few days in Leicester, UK (the area where Pastor Michelle's great-grandparents emigrated). Then, on June 9, they will head back to London where they will meet her husband Aaron. On June 17, they will head to Paris for a week, and on June 24, they will be spending a few days in Amsterdam. They will fly back to St. Louis on June 28, 2025. Throughout their time in England, Paris, and Amsterdam, they will be visiting many places that are connected with the arts and her family heritage.

After another two weeks, Pastor Michelle and Aaron will be heading to the UCC General Synod in Kansas City from July 11-July 15, 2025 where she is a delegate and has been writing opening worship. She will add a week of continuing education for General Synod.

Then around June 26, Pastor Michelle, Aaron, and her mom will be going to St. Catharines, Ontario, Canada where her mom was born. During Pastor Michelle's childhood, she would spend a month with her family each summer there, and she is hoping to revisit many of the places where she spent time with her family. After two weeks in Canada, they will return to Belleville to spend time regrouping before returning to St. Paul UCC on August 26.

Who will cover when Pastor Michelle is away?

Pastor Michelle and church leaders have been in conversation with the various areas of church life throughout the past few months to organize who will carry on the pastor's duties.

Sunday morning worship:

We have a number of clergy who will be leading the worship services: Rev. Dr. Chance Beeler (chaplain and St. Paul member), Rev. Diane Grohmann (retired pastor and St. Paul member), Rev. Justin Lopez (Scott Air Force Base), Rev. Doug Stewart (Memorial Hospital chaplain), Rev. Carolyn Held (ministry support service coordinator at the Mercy Retreat Center in St. Louis and Pastor Michelle's former contextual education supervisor when at Lydia's House), Rev. Shana Johnson (Illinois South Conference Minister), Rev. Joan Meir (retired pastor).

Pastoral Care:

We also have a number of clergy who will be on-call for emergencies and funerals. Our With You team will be conducting hospital, home, and other various pastoral care visits. During the week, if you or your family member is having a health or life crisis, please contact the office at (618) 233-3303 M-Th 8:30am-4pm and Friday 9am-noon.

General Questions:

Council Vice President Mimi Llamas will be the point person for the sabbatical, and questions may be directed to her while Pastor Michelle is away. When the office is closed, please contact Mimi or Susan Relfe with a pastoral emergency.

Funerals:

Please contact Sherry Wilhelm in the church office so that she can coordinate the funeral with an on-call member of the clergy and/or ensure church space is available if a service is needed in the sanctuary or Heritage Hall.

Administrative:

Council President Roger Harris will also be involved in administrative duties. If there is a personnel concern, chair Brett White will be available.

Who will make decisions for the church?

St. Paul UCC will be business as usual! While Pastor Michelle gives input to many decisions made as head of staff and ex-officio on Church Council, St. Paul UCC's due process based on our bylaws is that Church Council makes most significant decisions (and, from time-to-time, the Congregation). When smaller decisions need to be made, Mimi Llamas will coordinate with our various teams and their leaders to handle day-to-day issues that may arise. Furthermore, teams will continue to do some planning throughout the summer as they look towards Fall 2025.



A Message From Rev. Shana Johnson

In the Illinois South Conference, pastoral sabbaticals are negotiated into most call agreements for our settled pastors, as sabbaticals are a part of our compensation guidelines in our Conference. We affirm that their purpose is as stated in the UCC resource, *A Sure Foundation*:

"Rooted in the Biblical commands for Sabbath, a sabbatical is a significant time of rest, renewal, and refreshment for pastors. For pastors, the sabbatical is a time to nourish their relationship with God, recommit to their call, and provide renewed vision and focus for ministry. A sabbatical is not a vacation, but it does provide time away from the daily work of ministry. Sabbatical leave may include study or a project, but its first goal is reconnecting with one's sense of vocation through rest, reflection, and prayer."

I have witnessed the benefit of sabbaticals for both the pastor and the congregation. For a pastor, a sabbatical can allow them to refocus on ministry, contribute to their spiritual growth, prevent burnout, and establish new patterns for work and self-care. For a congregation, a sabbatical can enable longer tenures of pastors, promote congregational self-sufficiency, and rekindle a sense of excitement and possibility with their pastor, who returns with a sense of refreshment and renewal.

In 2022, I took a sabbatical after delaying it two years because of COVID. While many understood and affirmed the value of my taking advantage of this benefit that was a part of my call agreement and compensation, some did not understand the need for a sabbatical. Those who did not understand the purpose of this time away questioned its value and voiced their disagreement. Some of the comments that I heard were:

"Doesn't she already get vacation time?

Why are we paying her to rest?

It must be nice; I worked for 30 years and never got that time off."

I will confess that I understood those comments. Coming from a blue-collar family (Mom was a preschool teacher, and Dad was a technician for the phone company) in which my parents did not have this compensation and time benefit, I felt a bit guilty about taking a sabbatical (something I had unwisely not done in parish ministry).


I will also confess in the planning stages before my sabbatical because there was so much to do to get ready as I would not be attending meetings, conducting trainings, preaching, processing payroll, managing staff, or even answering voicemails and emails during my sabbatical, I wondered if it would be worth it. When the person we had contracted with to be the sabbatical Conference Minister fell ill, I thought about giving up the idea. Fortunately, the Personnel Committee and Conference Council insisted I take a sabbatical, and together we found a workable solution.

That sabbatical time, fully away without the pressure and expectations of responding to concerns and crises that happened 24/7, allowed me to reconnect with my family, helped me reestablish better self-care practices, and deepened my faith and spirituality, reigniting my creativity and passion for the ministry. I rebuilt a reservoir of resilience that I would never have known at the time I would need to face the leadership challenges at DuBois Center, changes in the Conference, and my own health concerns. All of this is to say that I understand the purpose and power of sabbaticals at a deeper level.

So, dear friends, as your pastor prepares for her sabbatical, I want to thank you for honoring this covenant you made with her and, more importantly, for supporting and affirming her taking this time away for rest and renewal. I fervently pray that Rev. Michelle's sabbatical brings renewal and reignites your mutual ministry as pastor and congregation.
