Well, friends, summer (with the associated heat and humidity) is upon us. While it can be oppressive, the warm–or hot–longer days allow for time outdoors and opportunities to cool off and escape the heat. Summer has a slower pace, but that does not mean that our congregational life is on hold until the temperatures cool in the fall.

We have entered into the season of the church calendar known as Ordinary Time. It's an interesting name because, for many, the word "ordinary" means nothing spectacular is taking place. While it is true that this season does not include the holidays and festivals (Christmas and Easter) that mark our Christian faith, so it is more "ordinary in that sense; however, the season after Pentecost is the longest one, and we count those Sundays with ordinal numbers (first, second, third, and so on)--thus the second meaning of the word "ordinary" for this liturgical period. The color of the season is green, and– until the typical midwestern drought sets in–we see that color around us in this part of the world during this season of the church. Green is a traditional symbol of life and growth. That is also the purpose of Ordinary Time. To grow in faith and live in the Spirit celebrated at Pentecost.

So, with that in mind, a reminder of *life* at St. Paul *still happening* during these lazy days (some of which is featured in ads further on in this month's OSP):

- We will continue to have special guests (and members) in the pulpit while Pastor Michelle continues her sabbatical. July 6 will be a communion Sunday with Rev. Dr. Chance Beeler (St. Paul member) in the pulpit. July 13 will be a hymn sing service full of inspirational singing. July 20, we will welcome back Rev. Dr. Jeremy Lopez (chaplain at Scott AFB), and on July 27, our Illinois South Conference Minister, the Rev. Shana Johnson will be preaching.
- The Seekers Bible study group and friends will be taking a second outing-this one to the Science Center on July 17, leaving at 9 AM. Call the church office to RSVP or get more details.
- Friday, July 18 (from 12-6 PM) and Saturday, July 19 (9 AM-4 PM) we will be hosting a big sale featuring some teacher supplies, children's books, toys, and more in the Activity Center.
- July 21-24 we will again be partnering with Trinity UCC (the host) for Vacation Bible School for preschoolers through fifth graders. The theme this year is "Compassion Camp." Registration is open now.
- Yoga continues on Mondays and Thursdays; the Shufflers will be playing cards at Pastor Gus's house on the 8th of July, and other weekly events will take place (see the calendar).

This season is also a time to grow in faith, so even though some of us head off to distant locales for the summer or take much-needed vacations, it is still a great time to connect with our church family as well when we are able. It's really quite an extra-ordinary time of the year.



Happy July! Last month, our team assisted and cared for the loved ones of three members who passed. Many of our members participate in assisting funerals held at St. Paul and attend funerals for members and friends of our congregation held in other locations. While you do not have to be a member of our team in order to do that, if that is a calling that you wish to answer, we can always use help with caring calls and cards.

Based on our contact with those in our congregation, we still have around 17 people who are in need of prayers for healing and support due to varying situations. We make it a priority to let those people know that they are not alone and supported by the larger congregation as well. Just under 25 members and friends are in long-term or assisted-living facilities. This month, we will be focusing on revising our guidelines for team members and reviewing procedures to make sure that we are making the best possible use of our time and human resources to serve those who need a caring word and/or presence

As always, we can always put someone to work, so if you want to be part of this incredible group, contact Susan Relfe (**susanrelfe@outlook.com**) if you would like to be part of this group. On a weekly basis, take home (or tear out the page with) the list of those we are keeping in prayer. We are encouraging ALL members to consider taking the prayer list home on Sundays (it's published in the weekly bulletin) or check it online (it's under the Media tab) and pray for those listed. God knows their needs, and your thoughtful petitions do make a difference; likewise, **if you could use the support of our team or know a member of the church who could, please call the church office (233-3303).** That communication is vital to our ministry.
