People: Our spirits carry the memory of such sacrificial love and unconditional care for those who truly walk with the Lord.


ALL: We are in awe of all that you do for us, O' Lord our God. Let our worship magnify your holy name, forever and ever. Amen.

I Would Be True


Phil. 4:8-9


